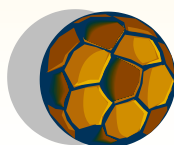
Spotlight on Diverse Learners

Help one another (Galatians 5:13).

January 24, 2010

"Building the Church" (based on Exodus 35:1-35; 36:1-6)

Work together (Ephesians 6:7).

January 31, 2010

"Paul Told Lydia About Jesus" (based on Acts 16:11-15)

Learn about Jesus (2 Peter 3:18).
